

# Download Emily Jane Brontë And Her Music

Emily Jane Brontë (/ ˈ b r ɔ̃ n t i /, commonly /-t e? /; 30 July 1818 – 19 December 1848) was an English novelist and poet who is best known for her only novel, *Wuthering Heights*, now considered a classic of English literature. The only poems by Emily Brontë that were published in her lifetime were included in a slim volume by Brontë and her sisters Charlotte and Anne titled *Poems by Currer, Ellis, and Acton Bell* (1846), which sold a mere two copies and received only three unsigned reviews in the months following its publication. Patrick Brontë (17 March 1777 – 7 June 1861), was born in Loughbrickland, County Down, Ireland, of a family of farm workers of moderate means. His birth name was Patrick Prunty or Brunty.
