Harold Garfinkel (October 29, 1917 – April 21, 2011) was an American sociologist, ethnomethodologist, and a Professor Emeritus at the University of California, Los Angeles. He is known for establishing and developing ethnomethodology as a field of inquiry in sociology. He is probably best known for his classic book, *Studies in Ethnomethodology*, which was published in 1967, a collection of ...*Social Science Dictionary with a Durkheim bias*, linked to Andrew Roberts' *Social Science History*.
