The following are some of the more famous haiku that were penned by the early Japanese haiku masters such as Bashō, Issa, Buson and Shiki. As original haiku are in Japanese and our English 5-7-5 syllables are an approximation at best, much of the poetry below does not appear in 5-7-5. Spring is a season of new life and growth. It is a very vocabulary-driven unit, which can be beneficial for ELLs because the vocabulary is concrete and reinforced through pictures and text. Kobayashi Issa (??? , June 15, 1763 – January 5, 1828) was a Japanese poet and lay Buddhist priest of the Jōdo Shinshū sect known for his haiku poems and journals. He is better known as simply Issa (??), a pen name meaning Cup-of-tea (lit. "one [cup of] tea"). He is regarded as one of the four haiku masters in Japan, along with Bashō, Buson and Shiki — "the Great Four." A collection of haiku by the Japanese poet, Kobayashi Issa.
